

EVENT SAFETY INFORMATION



YOUR ACCREDITATION PASS AND LANYARD MUST BE WORN AND DISPLAYED AT ALL TIMES.

Site Rules

These requirements have been developed to ensure your and others safety whilst on site.

Failure to comply to these safety standards can have serious impacts for the individual and those in the general area. Site personnel who observe someone breaching these requirements are encouraged to report to their nominated AGPC rep or AGPC Safety Brian Smith 0421 616 632 or Jackson Attwood 0401 861 955. Contractor management and site supervisors are responsible for communicating and monitoring full compliance.

Breaches of any of the below safety rules may result in removal of vehicle and / or immediate dismissal from site.

Licence/Verification of Competence (VOC)

- Workers accessing a designated Construction Zone MUST hold a compliant Construction White card, or equivalent.
- No works are to be undertaken by persons who do not hold the appropriate licence, qualification or VOC.
- All accredited contractors and visitors must complete the on-line site induction prior to entry to site during the construction phase.

Plant & Equipment

- Please be aware of high-risk plant and equipment operating around the site.
- Do not walk under suspended loads or behind reversing vehicles.
- Operators of plant and equipment must hold the appropriate licence or competency to operate.

Security

- All persons entering site must be registered and approved to do so by iEDM or AGPC.
- All gates and access points must be immediately closed after entry or exit and locked where appropriate.
- No fence lines are to be broken without the prior approval of iEDM.
- Operators must remove keys from the vehicle and lock any doors (if applicable) when parked or left unattended and where applicable, use the supplied lock to secure an Accessory Vehicle (buggy) when parked or left unattended.

Hazards & Incident Reporting

- Visitors must immediately report hazards to their nominated AGPC rep or AGPC Safety.
- Visitors must report all Incidents and Near Misses to their nominated AGPC rep or AGPC Safety Officer / Manager.

Vehicle Use








- Vehicles must comply with site specific speed limits.
- Motorcycle and cycle riders must wear a compliant helmet whilst in motion.
- All vehicles and Accessory Vehicles (eg: buggies and ATV's) **must** be fitted with seat belts and all passengers and vehicle operators **must** wear seatbelts at all times whilst the vehicle is in motion. Any vehicle and accessory vehicle found without a seat belt fitted will be quarantined and removed from site immediately.
- All vehicles must travel on designated roadways / pathways and are not permitted in vehicle no-go zones during gate opening times throughout the event. The only exception is emergency and critical maintenance vehicles that may travel through no-go zones during gate opening times but must be accompanied by a spotter to the front of the vehicle and the vehicle must travel at walking pace only. Failure to comply will result in penalty.
- All vehicles operating on shared pedestrian roadways **must** always travel at walking pace and **must** have a spotter to the front of the vehicle when congestion dictates.
- Vehicles must park in designated parking areas only and for a maximum 15 minutes in designated loading bays.
- No mobile phone use whilst operating any type of vehicle.
- General public are not to be conveyed in event vehicles.
- Passengers are not to ride in or on vehicles where no seat is fitted: no seat – no ride.
- Operators must not operate a vehicle while under the influence of any alcohol, illicit drugs or medications that may impact the Operator's ability to operate the vehicle.

General

- Approval must be obtained from iEDM prior to driving vehicle on grassed areas or soft ground.
- All site safety and information signage must be complied with.
- All site and event safety instructions, rules and directives must be complied with at all times.

PPE Requirements

Please review the list below of required items, some items are required for all workers on site, some items are only required by workers undertaking specific activities. For further information, please contact your nominated representative, or site management.

Albert Park and Public Safety

Albert Park is a public park and is open to the public during all build and dismantle phases. All persons must ensure the public remain safe at all times and their presence in the park is recognised and respected.

- All visitors, contractors and third parties should be aware that children and adults are frequently walking, running, riding bikes, walking their dogs etc.
- The onsite speed limit is strictly 10km/h.

Internal Roadways, Tunnel Access, Parking & Permits

Internal roadways (Aughtie Drive) are numbered during the build / dismantle.

- Parking permits / tickets / accreditation must be on display at all times.
- Use only designated parking bays: do not park on the grass.

There are three (3) tunnels within Albert Park with height restrictions.

TUNNEL	HEIGHT
North Tunnel (Infield Direction Only)	2.6m
South Tunnel (Outfield Direction Only)	2.6m
Middle Park Tunnel @ Gate 1 / Canterbury Road	2.1m

NOTE: the Racetrack will be closed to all personnel on Wednesday 20th March due to motorsport activities

Any vehicle found parked in the wrong location or without the appropriate accreditation may be towed at the owner's expense.
